

5 Simple Rules for Home School High School Record Keeping



Start with a good quality binder. You will want your binder to be attractive and hold up well under 4-6 years of use.

Research your state's graduation requirements.

You will need to know:

- number of credits required to graduate
- required subjects
- number of electives required

Make a 4-year or 6-year High School Plan. Don't forget that your child can begin earning credit in 7th or 8th grade.

Begin tracking your child's credits. Be sure to include:

- class name
- number of credits earned
- grade and year credit was earned

Keep all of these important items for records!

- Test scores
- Attendance records
- Employment records
- Job shadowing
- Letters of recommendation
- Copies of textbook covers and copyright pages
